To be accredited, a Course Student must:

At the course:

- ⇒ return this Enrolment
- ⇒ attend all sessions
- ⇒ complete the activities and assessment tasks to a satisfactory standard

After the course:

- ⇒ hold a current Bronze Licence
- ⇒ have current **ascta** coach membership
- ⇒ provide a current nationwide police check

Recognition of Current Competency (RCC):

Some potential Course Students may be able to satisfy all or some of the competency requirements for accreditation without having to attend the entire formal course. The RCC application kit can be obtained from SwimEd, if you think this applies to you. Complete and return the RCC application and supporting evidence along with fee of \$40 to SwimEd. The application will then be assessed. Further fees are payable if the application is successful (minimum \$100).

Payment, Refunds, Transfers & Course Cancellations:

Payment must be included when enrolling. You will be registered when your payment is cleared.

Your Course Administrator should be contacted **prior to the course commencement** if you are unable to attend the course. If the Course Administrator is administering another course at a suitable time and venue, you **may** be

able to transfer to this course. Otherwise refunds will incur a 25% administration fee.

Courses may be cancelled for a variety of reasons, at the Course Coordinator's discretion. In this event, a full refund of your course fee will be provided.

Because of this unlikely possibility, it is recommended that you consider separate insurance for accommodation and travel expenses.

Language, Literacy and Numeracy:

Course students should contact SwimEd if extra assistance is required. An extra fee may be charged.

Appeals and Complaints:
